## A BILL

- To provide for the establishment of a committee to identify and coordinate international science and technology cooperation that can strengthen the domestic science and technology enterprise and support United States foreign policy goals.

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "International Science
- 5 and Technology Cooperation Act of 2009".

# 1SEC. 2. COORDINATION OF INTERNATIONAL SCIENCE AND2TECHNOLOGY PARTNERSHIPS.

3 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Director of the Office of
4 Science and Technology Policy shall establish a committee
5 under the National Science and Technology Council with
6 the responsibility to identify and coordinate international
7 science and technology cooperation that can strengthen
8 the domestic science and technology enterprise and sup9 port United States foreign policy goals.

10 (b) RESPONSIBILITIES.—The committee established
11 under subsection (a) shall—

(1) plan and coordinate interagency international science and technology cooperative research
and training activities and partnerships supported or
managed by Federal agencies;

(2) establish Federal priorities and policies for
aligning, as appropriate, international science and
technology cooperative research and training activities and partnerships supported or managed by Federal agencies with the foreign policy goals of the
United States;

(3) identify opportunities for new international
science and technology cooperative research and
training partnerships that advance both the science
and technology and the foreign policy priorities of
the United States;

1 (4) work with international science and tech-2 nology counterparts to establish international science 3 and technology cooperative research and training 4 partnerships, as identified under paragraph (3); and 5 (5) establish, periodically update, and maintain 6 an inventory of all nonclassified international science 7 and technology cooperative research and training ac-8 tivities and partnerships that involve an annual 9 United States Federal investment of at least 10 \$500,000 dollars.

(c) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy shall transmit a report annually to Congress at the time of the President's
budget request describing the priorities and policies established under subsection (b)(2).

(d) PUBLICATION OF INVENTORY.—The Director of
the Office of Science and Technology Policy shall publish
the inventory required under subsection (b)(5) at least
once every 5 years, beginning 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
